Kentucky teachers for grades K-12 can apply for this free workshop to help them improve their skills in teaching civic education. Thirty-five teachers will be selected to participate. **The application deadline is Oct. 18.**

The workshop covers two civic education programs: *We the People ... The Citizen and the Constitution* and *Representative Democracy in America*. The Administrative Office of the Courts and the national Center for Civic Education are sponsoring the workshop. Robert S. Leming, national director of the *We the People* program, and Kentucky trainers will conduct the training.

Participants will receive free classroom materials associated with the courses to allow them to use the programs with their

students. In addition, lodging will be free for participants who must travel more than 30 miles to attend the workshop. All participants will receive free meals and reimbursement for mileage expenses.

Representative Democracy in America is a national project designed to reinvigorate and educate Americans on the critical relationship between government and the people it serves. The


