- 50th in smoking
- 40th in obesity
- 43rd in sedentary lifestyle
- 37th in children in poverty
- 30th in lack of health insurance
- 50th in preventable hospitalizations
- 43rd in low birth weight
- 41st in diabetes
- 48th in poor mental health days
- 49th in poor physical health days
- 43rd in cardiovascular deaths
- 50th in cancer deaths
- 44th in premature death
- 41st in youth obesity
- 43rd in youth smoking
- 49th in cardiac heart disease
- 43rd in high cholesterol
- 48th in heart attacks
- 46th in strokes
- 46th in high blood pressure
- 44th in preterm births
- 44th in annual dental visits

With Expansion


- ALL have access to coverage
- 308,000: below 138% FPL and can gain coverage through Medicaid
- 332,000: access to insurance through Health Benefit Exchange

Without Expansion

- 206,000: Coverage Gap
- Below 100% FPL ineligible for Medicaid or a federal subsidy in Exchange

Expansion Is Net Positive for Kentucky

With Expansion

- Improved health - EVERY Kentuckian can gain affordable health insurance
- \$15.6 billion positive economic impact by full implementation*
 - \$2.3 billion annual impact
 - Nearly 17,000 new jobs
- Positive budget impact of \$802.4 million*

Without Expansion

- Health rankings remain at the bottom
- Coverage gap for over 206,000 Kentuckians
- Negative budget impact of \$38.9 million because of additional ACA costs*
- KY businesses face up to \$48 million in penalties annually
- Payments to KY hospitals for indigent care cut by \$288 million*
