

ABOUT OUR CENTENNIAL EVENT SPEAKERS

Conference Speakers:

Nancy Ridenour, PHD, RN, APRN, BC, FAAN – Dean and Professor, College of Nursing, University of New Mexico. As a Robert Wood Johnson Health Policy Fellow, Dr. Ridenour worked with the Committee on Ways and Means in the US House of Representatives. She is recognized as an expert in health policy, health workforce and health care reform.

Kathy Apple, MS, RN, FAAN – CEO of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN), a position she has held since 2001. Ms. Apple has more than 39 years of experience in nursing and regulation as well as a strong commitment to the mission of NCSBN. She is a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Executive Nurse Fellow, a graduate of Leadership America, and credentialed by the American Society of Association Executives as a certified association executive.

Paula Schenk, MPH, RN – Executive Director of the Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN) and a veteran staff member for over 20 years, having worked in every aspect of the agency to further the mission of “protecting the public.” She obtained her Masters of Public Health Degree from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, NC. She is a member of the American Nurses Association and the Kentucky Nurses Association.

Nathan Goldman, JD – General Counsel of the Kentucky Board of Nursing since 1990. He is a graduate of the University of Louisville School of Law, and has previously served as Assistant Attorney General and Director of the Civil and Environmental Law Division. Presently Mr. Goldman is also serving as a Director-at-Large on the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Board of Directors.

Banquet Guest Speaker:

Tori Murden McClure, MDiv, JD, MFA – President, Spalding University is an explorer and adventurer whose travels have taken her to Kenya, Antarctica, Mt. Rainer, as well as across an ocean. She was the first woman to row solo across the Atlantic Ocean, and her adventures are depicted in her memoir, *A Pearl in the Storm* (Harper, 2009). Mrs. McClure believes the lessons learned in the wild have served her in her professional life as an attorney and civic and educational leader. She holds degrees from Smith College, Harvard University, University of Louisville, and Spalding University. Through her work she challenges the University to collaborate with its neighbors of the broadest sense, educational institutions, as well as civic and social service organizations—and to work with one another to meet the needs of the times.

Other Centennial Related Information:

Centennial Memorial Lapel Pins: In commemoration of this occasion, the Board has commissioned the development of lapel pins, containing the centennial logo designed by KBN staff Mary Jane Oswald and Adrienne Harmon. The pins will be available for purchase at the event site. All monies raised will be used to support the centennial events.

Centennial Publication of the Kentucky Board of Nursing History 1914-2014: In commemoration of this occasion, the Board has compiled three documents detailing its history. The history was published in two preceding documents: *The Kentucky Board of Nursing: 75 Years of Caring, 1914-1989*; and *A Bridge to 2000 History of the Decade: Kentucky Board of Nursing 1989-1999*. A third document *Kentucky Board of Nursing 2000-2014 Moving Into the Twenty-First Century*, by Nathan Goldman, KBN General Counsel, has been added to this collection. The history will be available for purchase at the event site. All monies raised will be used to support the centennial events.

DIRECTIONS:

University of Louisville's Shelby Campus, Founders Union Building is located at 9001 Shelbyville Road near Hurstbourne Parkway, less than 20 minutes from the heart of downtown and the Louisville International Airport.

Driving Directions:

From I-65 North: Take the I-264 East (Watterson Expressway) exit. After traveling approximately seven miles, take Exit 20A (Shelbyville Rd. E, US 60/Middletown). Be sure to stay right as you exit. Shelby Campus is approximately two miles down on the left, at the stop light at Whittington Pkwy.

From I-65 South:

Take the I-264 East (Watterson Expressway) exit. Follow the directions above.

From I-64 East:

Take Exit 12B (I-264 East/Watterson Expressway). Then take Exit 20A (Shelbyville Rd., US 60/ Middletown). Be sure to stay right as you exit. Shelby Campus is approximately two miles down on the left, at the stop light at Whittington Pkwy.

From I-64 West:

Take Exit 15 (Hurstbourne Pkwy., Middletown/Jeffersontown/Shelby Campus). Turn right onto Hurstbourne Pkwy. Travel approximately two miles to the intersection at Shelbyville Rd. (US 60). Turn left onto Shelbyville Rd. Shelby Campus is approximately 1/4 mile down on the right, at the stop light at Whittington Pkwy.

I-71 South:

Take the I-264 West (Watterson expressway) exit. This is a left turn. Travel approximately two miles, and then take the Shelbyville Rd. East exit (US 60/Middletown). Shelby Campus is approximately two miles down on the left, at the stop light at Whittington Pkwy.

Parking:

Parking is available in the lot behind the building. Handicapped accessible spaces are located closest to the building.
